Like a wet golden retriever's glorious full tail bouncing towards the sun, Cape Cod juts off of eastern Massachusetts and reaches into the mighty Atlantic Ocean. It is this pristine coastal setting that serves as the majestic backdrop for Kim Roderiques' delightful photography in DOGS ON CAPE COD.

If a picture is worth a thousand words, then this book speaks volumes. Brimming with images of big dogs with big dogs, and big dogs with small dogs, and mothers with puppies, and doggies with buddies, DOGS ON CAPE COD is a wealth of canine delights. From miniature Australian shepherds to Great Danes, and from wirehaired dachshunds to Pembroke Welsh corgis, the pages of DOGS ON CAPE COD feature the many breeds of dogs that romp in the region.

Simply put, DOGS ON CAPE COD is a book about love: love of the place and love of the dogs. The beautifully designed and lavish volume contains over 225 photographs that see the Cape through the eyes of the 205 different dogs featured in the book. Captions accompany every photo with each dog's name and breed, along with the shot's location. Quotes from famous dog-lovers such as Mary Oliver and Milan Kundera are interspersed throughout the book.

Frolicking alone, in pairs, or occasionally in small packs, DOGS ON CAPE COD features vibrant images of leash-free dogs full of joy, pleasure and often abandon. Whether fetching tennis balls and running like the wind, playing on a sandy beach in the Cape's ever-changing light, or posing for a portrait in a backyard garden's summer sun, this charming book is a celebration of dogs just being dogs on Cape Cod.
